In this book you will find information regarding applications, deadline dates, mailing addresses, and contacts for various scholarships, bursaries and awards.

This is a rough guide as it is impossible to keep information current. Dates and financial amounts are based on last year's information and may change from year to year.

Often students who have an average of 85% or higher in Grade 11 and have maintained this average in Grade 12 are considered for scholarships to most universities/colleges that they make application to. The deadline date for the majority of university entrance scholarships is March 1st.

It is important to check each university and college website for information on entrance scholarships and separate application forms. If you have any questions please see one of the School Counsellors.

Many businesses and organizations offer scholarships, bursaries and awards that you may seek out through advertisements, word of mouth, or the internet. The responsibility lies with you, the student, to investigate any and all avenues where these scholarships, bursaries and awards may be offered. You may want to check out the following web sites:

As we approach the end of the school year scholarships, bursaries and awards start appearing quickly and often will have shorter deadline dates. Many of these may require a copy of your transcripts, letters of recommendation/reference or perhaps an essay. Be sure to allow yourself and staff member's time to prepare any of these requirements.

Scholarships and awards that students accept will only be announced at the graduation ceremony once the student has provided a letter from the institution confirming the award. Please bring in a copy of your accepted offers to the School Counsellors.

September

- ✓ Post-secondary presentation to all grade 12 homerooms by school counsellors

D. P. Murphy Inc. Tuition Assistance Program - Deadline: Ongoing

- Award Value: Year One - \$200, Year Two - \$300 and Year Three - \$500
- Part-time team members aged 23 years or younger that are currently attending school can enroll in the program and provide D.P. Murphy Inc. with the following:
 - Three years of continuous unbroken service
 - Work a minimum of 12 hours/week while in school and 30 hours per week during the off-months (approximately 380 hours every six months).
- requirements and application process online

Community Service Bursary - Deadline: On-going

- offers Grade 10, 11 & 12 students a tuition credit of up to \$750.00 in recognition of volunteer hours
- hours must be from a non-profit and non-political organization
- requirements and application process available online and on Bluefield's Website

George Coles Bursary and Island Skills Award (No application necessary)

- eligible students must be residents of PEI
- to be eligible for this award students must provide Social Insurance number to Island post-secondary institution
- must have graduated from an Island high school
- are dependent students whose parent(s) are Island residents
- are independent students who meet Island residency requirements as stated in the Provincial Student Loan criteria
- be enrolled in programs leading to a post-secondary degree, diploma or certificate at UPEI, Holland College or College Acadia IPE
- be first-time students at UPEI, Holland College or College Acadia IPE in their first undergraduate degree, diploma or certificate program

Duke of Edinburgh's Award/Young Canadian Challenge - Deadline: On-going

- program designed to broaden interests and experiences in wide range of cultural, adventurous and practical activities
- non-competitive, self-directed program open to any young person age 14-25 years
- each of the three levels (bronze, silver, gold) is progressively more challenging than the previous one
- purpose is to encourage self-reliance, self-discipline, initiative, creativity and social responsibility

Morehead-Cain Scholarship – Deadline: September

- The Morehead-Cain Scholarship is a four year, fully funded scholarship for students of the highest caliber
- Students must be driven, courageous and curious leaders interested in embracing new unknown experience
- Students who want to make an impact.
- Students must be attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill
- More information online.

OHS Leadership Program - Deadline: September

- Award Value - \$500
- The Worker's Compensation Board is seeking two grade 11 or 12 students for its Occupational Health & Safety Leadership Program
- Student must work as a leadership team at your school to organize six events, spaced out over the school year. These events/activities will help to raise awareness among other students about workplace health and safety.
- Document events/activities and produce a year-end summary
- Student must be good at connecting with other students and coordinating with school staff
- Student must be interested in learning, and helping others to learn, about how to stay safe at work.
- Student must be planning to further his/her education/training sometime after high school.

- eight Island students selected (Island high schools are selected on a rotation basis)
- open to grade 10, 11 and 12's but preference is given to grade 12's
- asset to have knowledge and interest in current events and our political system
- Political Science 521 and 621 an asset
- requires at least 2 shifts per week at the PEI Legislative Assembly
- approximately \$120/week plus mileage
- students selected by an interview process
- requirements and application process available in Student Services and with teacher advisor

Rotary Youth Parliament – Deadline: September

- Open to grade 10, 11 and 12's, but preference is given to grade 12's
- Three students selected by an interview process
- Students attend a mock youth parliament in the PEI Legislative Assembly
- Individual research and group meetings required

- award value - \$400 (2)
- bursary will be granted to two students entering the Transition Program at UPEI
- this bursary is renewable for the same student upon his/her continuation into bachelor-level studies at UPEI in the following academic year.
- completed application form and financial need form
- high school transcript sent to UPEI Registrar
- requirements and application process available online

The Loran Award - Deadline: October

- award value up to \$100,000
- must be graduating this year and attending a university that sponsors the Loran Award (see application)
- academic average of at least 85% (in 621/521/421 courses)
- main criteria is exceptional school leadership and community involvement
- students have to demonstrate the ability to deal with change and disappointment
- students can **apply direct** by mid-October if school does not sponsor them
- requirements and application process online

Pipe Line Contractors Association of Canada Student Award Program – Deadline: October

- son or daughter of a person whose principal income is derived from the pipeline construction industry. The parent or guardian of the applicant must be employed by or have a history of employment with a company who is a member of the Pipe Line Contractors Association of Canada
- proof of a full-time enrollment in a program leading to a diploma or degree in any field at a recognized Canadian college or university
- applications received from students enrolled in post-graduate programs may also be considered
- requirements and application process online

University of Toronto National Book Award - Deadline: October

- demonstrates superior academic performance, original and creative thought and exceptional achievement in a broad context
- demonstrates enthusiasm for intellectual exploration and an involvement in the life of their school and community
- does not have to be attending University of Toronto
- one student selected by the Scholarship Committee
- requirements and application process online

- approximately 50 scholarships available to First Nations, Inuit & Metis as recognized by the Federal Government
- award values vary

Forum for Young Canadians – Deadline: November

- two Bluefield students selected each year by an interview process
- Canada's longest running and most successful youth program about Canadian government and our governmental institutions
- approximately 600 students (aged 15-19 years) from across Canada go to Ottawa in four separate weeklong sessions each spring
- experience Parliament Hill first-hand and see how the Canadian government works and the values it promotes
- cost is approximately \$900 (tuition and travel) - some financial assistance available to students
- requirements and application process available in Student Services and with teacher advisor

Rotary Adventure in Citizenship Program – Deadline: November

- Open to grade 10, 11 and 12's but preference is given to Grade 12's
- This program is intended to promote a greater understanding and appreciation of citizenship in Canada;
- This program is organized and managed by volunteer members of the Rotary Club of Ottawa.
- A one week conference in Ottawa

National Student Commonwealth Forum – Deadline: November

- Open to grade 10, 11 and 12's but preference is given to grade 12's
- Two students selected each year by an interview process; one week social studies experience in Ottawa;
- A hundred or more young minds from every region of Canada coming together to explore global issues and to participate in a unique learning experience;
- A week-long session of discussion, brainstorming, role-playing and learning; learning about difference cultures, countries institutions and contemporary issues; each Commonwealth country is "represented" by a two-person delegation of senior high school students;
- Those from outside the National Capital Region are billeted in homes of local families; the exchange Canada program contributes toward travel costs.

Pearson College – Lester B. Pearson United World College of the Pacific - Deadline: November

- award valued at \$80,000
- must be entering grade 11
- community service, interest in internationalism, good academic standing (average over 80% and 16 to 17 ½ years of age
- requirements and online application available at <http://applicaiton.pearsoncollege.ca>

Rotary International Youth Exchange - Deadline: November

- above-average student with demonstrated leadership in the community and open to new experiences and cultural differences sponsored by a local Rotary Club
- Rotary Youth Exchange is open to young people ages 15-19 worldwide. There are two basic types of exchanges: short-term and long-term
- short-term exchange for students ages 15-19 which can range from several days to several weeks in length; does not involve attending high school, but students can tailor their experience to match their interests; can include home stays, tours, and international youth camps
- long-term exchange for students ages 15-19 which is one year in length; involves living with a few host families and attending a local school
- requirements and application process online

Shad Valley Program - Deadline: November & January

- Shad Valley is a four week summer enrichment program
- students spend a month living in residence at one of the host university campuses across Canada
- the program is offered to students currently completing grade 10, 11 or 12
- high academic achievers and innovators
- the program focus includes the sciences, technology and entrepreneurship and provides an academically stimulating, mind expanding adventure for top well-rounded students.
- requirements and application process online

TD Canada Trust Scholarship - Deadline: November

- award valued at \$10,00 for tuition per academic year and \$7,500 a year for living stipend, plus summer employment
- this scholarship is open to students across Canada (Canadian citizen) who are in their final year of high school
- Students must demonstrate outstanding community leadership, possess the academic skill to successfully enter and complete college or university and plan to attend a college or university in Canada
- requirements and application process online

Vimy Pilgrimage Award – Deadline: November

- award consists of a fully funded week long educational program in Vimy, France to study Canada's tremendous First World War effort
- students must submit a motivation letter of 500 word maximum, outlining the reasons why they are worthy of this award
- applicant must be aged 14-17
- requirements and application process online

Arthur Paulin Automotive Aftermarket Scholarship – Deadline: November

- award value - \$700
- student must be enrolled in an automotive aftermarket industry related program or curriculum at a Canadian college or university, this includes students pursuing their studies as an automotive apprentice, as well as studies of the following automotive sectors: auto body, hard parts, heavy duty, or motive power (machinists).
- requirements and application process available online.

The Royal Canadian Legion Remembrance Day Essay, Poem and Poster Contest – Deadline: November

- award Value - Win a trip for two to Ottawa to represent Canada's Youth at next year's National Remembrance Day Ceremony on November 11th and Essay – 1st Prize - \$1,000; 2nd Prize - \$500; Poem – 1st Prize - \$1,000; 2nd Prize - \$500
- all entries to be submitted to the local legion branch
- the contest is open to all Canadian students in the Canadian School System
- entries may be submitted in either French or English
- entries will be marked on the basis of originality of thought, expression, presentation, grammar, spelling and Canadian content.
- candidates must complete an official Registration Form, available from the local Legion Branch or online at www.legion.ca and attach it to their entry.

- student must have a cumulative grade average of 70% or higher
- be a high school senior graduating from grade 12
- plans to enroll in a two or four-year college university or vocational-technical school
- participation in community service/co-curricular activities
- requirements and application process online

Canadian Parliament House of Commons Page Program - Deadline: December

- work as a Page in the House of Commons during your first year of study at one of the Universities in the National Capital Region
- pages are given the rare opportunity to watch the House of Commons in action and to meet other young people from all parts of the country
- must be a Canadian citizen or have permanent resident and must have an over-all academic average of at least 80%
- to be able to speak both official languages at a superior level

- one student selected by the Scholarship Committee
- academic excellence
- demonstrated leadership in school life and community life or provided evidence of entrepreneurial talent
- one page essay on why you feel you should be nominated
- list the name of the university/universities you wish to attend as well as what program you are interested in pursuing
- requirements and application process online

MADD Central PEI Bursary – Deadline: January

- must be considering pursuing post-secondary education at a recognized institution
- must live within MADD Central PEI jurisdiction (Bluefield or Kinkora High Schools)

- be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- entering university
- requirements and application process online

Bronfman Youth Fellowships in Israel - Deadline: January

- summer program of 5 weeks awarded to twenty-six individuals who will be entering Grade 12 in the fall of 2013
- currently enrolled in the 11th grade
- fellowship awards based on merit demonstrated in the fields of intellectual curiosity and accomplishment, response to challenge, and leadership both among peers and within established organizations
- requirements and application process online

The Steam Horizon Award - \$25,000 (5) – Deadline: January

- award value - \$25,000 (5) + two additional prizes for Indigenous Youth
- To be eligible to apply, you must:
- be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada;
- be 16 to 18 years of age at time of application;
- have been recognized for accomplishments in a formal capacity (e.g. selected as a winner or participant of a science fair, patent application, conference presentation) or less formal capacity (e.g. founding a coding club, developing a course for kids, creating an interactive art installation);
- have obtained, over the previous year of study, an academic average of 85% or higher;
- be preparing to enroll in the Fall of 2019 or currently enrolled in the first year of post-secondary education (university or college) in a STEAM field* in Canada.

- students and their counterpart (a young person from the exchange country) get involved in a host community through volunteer service
- must be a Canadian citizen in good health

Explore - Deadline: February

explore offers courses adapted to the student=s level (beginner, intermediate, or advanced) as well as many activities allowing students to meet with others from across the country who share a desire to improve their second language

- explore is a five-week intensive language-learning course taken in the spring or summer
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident (those studying in Canada on a student visa are not eligible)have completed at least grade 11
- participants in Explore receive a \$2,000 bursary covering tuition fees for the course, instructional materials, meals, and accommodation - the teaching institution you will be attending will receive the bursary directly
- some schools offer the possibility of credit transfers (please check with Bluefield administration)
- requirements and application process online

Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation – National Scholarship and Citizenship Awards – Deadline: February

- award value \$1,000 (30)
- candidates who demonstrate exemplary citizenship qualities in their home, school and communities through extensive community service, volunteerism and commitment to humanitarian causes
- be in need of financial assistance to further their educational plans
- provide evidence of potential success to continue to post-secondary education and training
- must be a Canadian resident who is graduating from grade 12
- requirements and application process available online

- student must demonstrate high ideals and qualities of citizenship and not have previously received a bursary from the Hal Rogers Endowment Fund
- requirements and application process online

Symons Lecture Essay Contest - Deadline: February

- essay contest - \$1,000 First Prize, \$750 Second Prize and \$250 Third Prize
- grade 11 & 12 students from Prince Edward Island are invited to write an original and creative essay related to the topic or theme of the 2012 Symons Medal & Lecture on the state of Canadian Confederation. This essay is to be not more than 1000 words and not less than 700 words

Canadian Right of Way Educational Foundation High School Scholarship – Deadline: March 31st

- award valued at \$1000
- awarded to a graduating student who is entering full time studies in any of the various fields impacting the right of way profession. Areas of study may include (but not limited to) law, surveying, engineering, planning, real property appraisal, public administration or environmental studies
- transcript
- letter of recommendation from faculty advisor or guidance counsellor
- letter of recommendation from an employer or professional associate. (If you have not had significant employment, the letter may be from community leader or clergyman with whom you are personally acquainted.)
- provide a brief Bio of yourself
- requirements and application process online.

Future Health Research & Innovation Scholarships – Deadline: March

- award value at \$2,500
- must intend on continuing their education at a Maritime post-secondary institution, in a field that will enhance health research and/or innovation
- write an essay demonstrating their interest in health related research and/or innovation and how it will improve the health and well-being of children, women or families in the Maritimes
- Requirements and application process online

Harrison McCain Scholarships (Acadia,UNB, Dal, STU) - Deadline: March

- award valued at \$4,000
- based on financial need
- average of 80% or higher & possess leadership qualities
- must contribute financially to his/her own education
- make sure the application is for the university you are applying to
- deadlines vary according to each university
- requirements and application process online

Kerrilynn McInnis Memorial Scholarship – Deadline: March

- award valued at \$500
- provide annually a scholarship towards post-secondary education for Ringette players, who have demonstrate strong commitment to the sport of Ringette
- must be enrolled full-time in a recognized post-secondary education institution for the next academic year
- applicants must meet the admission standards of the educational institution specified
